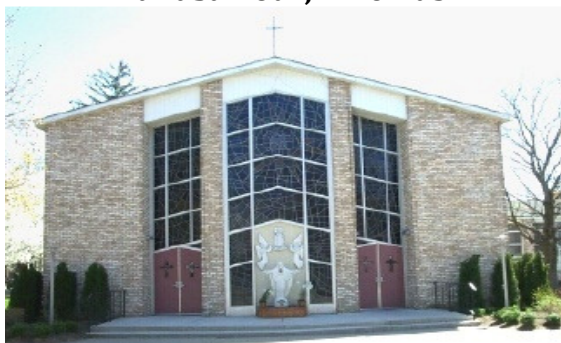

Rite of Christian Initiation of Adults (RCIA)

As we approach a new liturgical year, we approach the time where our **RCIA** team starts the RCIA process. Deacon Jack Carr has already started accompanying a candidate on this RCIA process. Deacon Jack, being the new coordinator of our RCIA program, would like to thank Marcia Acevedo for the untiring work that she has done for the program, having been the coordinator of our RCIA program up until this past year. As a parish we are so grateful to Marcia for her commitment and generosity in running the program. She continues to volunteer her time and talent to assist the RCIA process where needed. We would like to thank Deacon Jack for taking over the RCIA process, accompanying Catholics and converts into our Catholic Faith.

The letters **RCIA** stand for the **Rite of Christian Initiation of Adults**. It is a document that has come from the renewal of Vatican II. This document guides the process by which adults are called to become full members of the community of the Roman Catholic Church. RCIA was promulgated in 1972 by the Congregation of Divine Worship. It describes a process through which interested men and women are gradually introduced to Catholic faith and its way of life. Through this process, they are guided and cared for as they awaken in faith.

The RCIA process is a communal process, which involves a number of carefully planned stages. They are marked by liturgical rites in the presence of the whole faith community in order to help the fledgling Christian to reach the final rite. The final rite is usually at the Easter Vigil at which time they will become full members of the Catholic Church. And so, during these rites, the converts gradually join the Holy Catholic Church in a continuing and a deepening conversion experience. However, the entire process takes several months.

When we explore the history of **RCIA**, it is not something new. It is an ancient Order of Christian Initiation. Small Christian communities in the early Church introduced individuals into their way of life. Amidst severe religious persecution, they were called to be a strong faith in order to stand firm in the face of possible martyrdom. And so, becoming a Christian in the early days of the Church involved a break with the surrounding culture. New Christians entered into a new way of living and a life-sharing community of faith in the Risen Lord. In the earliest centuries of the Church, adult Baptism was the norm. Infants were baptized only when they were children of adults who converted to Christianity. However, the Scriptures demonstrate that the early Church baptized babies (Acts 2:38-39) since entire households were baptized.

RCIA is a process of conversion and it draws its model from the “*catechumenate*” of the ancient Church. Catechumens are the candidates, who have not been baptized or baptized Christians who have not been confirmed as Roman Catholics. The length of the catechumenate varies according to the needs of the individual.

RCIA is an ongoing process, a step-by-step journey of faith, and a community event. Faith in Jesus Christ involves deeper commitment. This commitment is a new way of life that involves some ways of breaking our former patters and former way of lives in order to stand firm with our beliefs as Catholics. Conversion is not once-in-a-lifetime event. We all experience God’s call to turn around, change our lives, and improve our relationships with the Lord.

The RCIA team will soon be starting their journey of faith for the 2016 and 2017 year. If anyone is interested in becoming Catholic or who is Catholic, but has not received all of their sacraments of initiation: Baptism, First Holy Communion, and Confirmation, please contact Deacon Jack for further information regarding the RCIA.

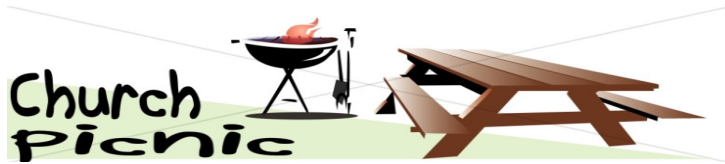
